

ARTS & CRAFTS

- Draw a tree trunk on paper. Cut up a kitchen sponge into small squares and clip them on to clothespins. Let your child sponge paint different colored leaves onto the tree.
- Leaf rubbings. Collect leaves and place bottom side up on a hard surface. Place paper over top of leaves and gently rub a crayon across the surface to reveal the leaf pattern.
